SAINT OF THE MONTH

St. Rita of Cascia – May 22

Rita was born in Roccaporena, Italy in 1381 of elderly parents. Although she desired to become a nun, her parents arranged a marriage for her at age 12, to an older man, who was abusive, prone to gambling, and a member of a feuding and violent clan. Rita's patience, obedience, fidelity and charity converted her husband before he was murdered. Her prayer also saved their two sons who wanted to avenge their father's death. After several years as a widow, she was able to persuade the Augustinian nuns at Cascia to allow her to join them. She was devoted to the Passion of Christ and received a bleeding wound in her forehead from the crucified Christ

to share in his suffering. Rita died on May 22, 1457. She is the patron saint of widows, abuse victims, the lonely, those experiencing marriage difficulties, and impossible cases. Her feast day is May 22.



Saint Rita, God gave you to us as an example of charity and patience and offered you a share in the Passion of His Son. May your example encourage me to carry my own Cross patiently and to live a holier life. By serving God as you did, may I please Him with my faith and my actions. In your kindness, hear my prayer and ask God to grant me this particular request if it be His Will: (Mention your request). May your prayers help me to live in fidelity to my calling as you did and bring me to the deeper love of God and my neighbor until I reach eternal life in heaven. Amen.
